- Last year, 1/3 of all European retirees registered in a Spanish town did it in the Costa Blanca.
- In 16 municipalities, foreigners are more than Spaniards.
- Most old-age pensioners are British or German in many towns, e.g., Calp 80%
- Motivation seems to be the key to understand this kind of mobility known as leisure migration or international retirement migration.

- Both qualitative and quantitative research.
- 10 in-depth interviews to key informants.
- A personal in-home survey with a sample of 667 interviews to German and British retired citizens.
 - Confidence Level: 99% (2σ)
 - Confidence Interval: +/- 5%
 - Systematic sampling with random grid position.
 - 12 towns.



We estimate:


- 50,000 German retirees.
- 156,000 Britons.
- Average age: 62.6 years old.
 - German older than Britons.
- High education level: higher in British population.
