1. + 2 objects

Remember me to your father

2. + to Infinite

I must remember to buy some fruit for dinner

3. + Gerund clause

I remember seeing Paul last year

I don't remember your mentioning that

4. Nexus + subordinate

I can't remember where I have the keys

5. How + to infinitive

Do you remember how to do it?

To Forget

1. To Infinitive

- I forgot to close the door
- I'll never forget to call you.

2. Gerund clause

- I forgot closing the door

I'll never forget dancing all night with him

I'll never forget her laughing at me

3. Nexus + subordinate

I forgot that I had to come earlier today

I forgot what I did yesterday.

4. When, How + to infinitive

I can't forget how to drive a car.

5. + [Prep. Phrase] about

I forgot about the conference

To Try

1. To Infinitive

- **I am trying to open the door, but I can't. It's really difficult!**
- **I'm trying to buy a lottery ticket, but I can't find a number I like.**

2. Gerund clause

- **You can't walk through doors, next time try opening the door first!**
- **I'm poor. Why don't you try buying a lottery ticket?**

3. And + bare infinitive

- **You must try and arrive on time.**
- **Try and come to the party.**
